Shift Work Coping Strategies for Heat Plant Workers: The Project was submitted to the SRU IRB and approved on 03/20/2025 and data was analyzed in April of 2025. The protocol Number was 2025-062-76-A.

Perceptions of the Usefulness of Exoskeletons for Lifting Tasks: This research project was initiated, but as of the end of March 2026, IRB for the human subject surveys has not been completed. CITI training was completed October of 2025 for this project which is good through October 2028.

2.2 Applications of established safety and health approaches are defined as determining, monitoring, and controlling workplace hazards that may pose safety and health risks to workers. The research project was completed outside of classes. Our research committee met on numerous occasions to research the topic, develop the questionnaire, and are currently waiting to collect and analyze the completed questionnaires. The students delivered the questionnaires to the Slippery Rock University Heat Plant and are hoping for 12 responses from the employees. The research committee also presented what they have done so far with the project at the Western PA Professional Development Conference on March 27th, 2025. The following is an abstract of the research project.

The Canadian Center of Occupational Health and Safety states, "The term "Rotational Shiftwork" covers a Wide Variety of work schedules and implies that shifts rotate or change according to a set schedule. These shifts can be either continuous, running 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, or semi-continuous, running 2 or 3 shifts per day with or without weekends. Workers take turns working on all shifts that are part of a particular system." By understanding how shift work affects workers, we can assist employers in making changes to help reduce the stress that shift work can place on workers.

The purpose of this project is to find out how shift work affects heat plant workers' coping mechanisms when dealing with stress or sleep. To test to see if there is any correlation between the two, the students are collecting questionnaire responses from heat plant workers from the Slippery Rock University Heat Plant. The questionnaires ask about participating demographics and ask questions about how they cope with stress from work and personal life.

The committee is hoping to find trends with the current participant pool and to expand to other

groups like Slippery Rock Emergency services like Police, Fire fighters, and EMTs. As we gather more data, we hope to find out how employers are helping and how they could help more to improve employees' experiences with shift work so they can reduce or eliminate the usage of coping strategies and improve employees' sleep. This project was finalized in May of 2025 which was titled "Shift Work Coping Strategies for Heat Plant Workers."

When it comes to the academic year of August 2025 to May 2026, our research project is titled "Perceptions of the Usefulness of Exoskeletons for Lifting Tasks." This project focuses on examining the growing role of exoskeleton technology in reducing physical strain during lifting tasks while also enhancing student preparedness for careers in safety and health. As the workplace continues to adopt innovative solutions to prevent injury, developing an early understanding of these technologies is essential for future professionals. Exoskeletons include full-body, upper-body, and lower-body systems, which are designed to support workers in physically demanding environments and improve both safety and efficiency. This project distinguishes itself by prioritizing student exposure to this emerging technology before entering internships or full-time positions. By introducing exoskeletons in an academic setting, the project helps bridge the gap between classroom learning and real-world application, equipping students with relevant, forward-thinking experience. The project is currently in the planning and development phase, with efforts focused on finalizing surveys, outlining procedures, and completing the IRB packet for approval. Once approval is obtained, the project will involve gathering students' feedback to better understand perceptions of exoskeleton use and how those perceptions may evolve with increased awareness and interaction. Overall, this project reflects a forward-looking approach to safety education by integrating innovative technology into the learning experience. It emphasizes the importance of preparing future safety professionals to adapt to evolving industry practices while promoting safer and more efficient work environments. The attached presentation was presented at the WPA ASSP PDC on March 26, 2026 during student section research session.

November 2025, SRU Safety Apparel Store Sale & Fundraiser; raised \$1,023.00 The SRU Student Section held an online storefront to purchase SRU Safety apparel to fundraise for ASSP events. 47 students and alumni ordered products from the online store.

December 2025, Holiday Rock; Students bought toys and clothing for six children from our local community to make sure they had Christmas gifts this year. 2 students participated in buying supplies.

SRU spoke to multiple classes at Butler High School about the safety profession and the importance of safety in every industry.

November 25, 2025, Coat Drive. SRU ASSP coordinated a coat drive over a two-week period and donated just under 50 gently used coats to students at Slippery Rock High School.

March 5, 2026, High School Outreach; Students showcased the safety profession as a career choice at the career fair at the Lawrence County Career & Technical Center. 6 students attended.

3.2 Section-sponsored campus activities (Section-sponsored is defined as activities initiated, planned and executed by the Student Section):

September 8, 2025, Leadership Team High Ropes Course Challenge Event; Student E-Board and Committee Leaders and SRU Section Advisors met to complete a bonding event at campus high ropes course, which allowed the team to work together and encourage one another. 7 Students and 1 Faculty Advisor.

September 16, 2025, Internship Panel: SRU Student Section hosted a campus-wide panel event for students, specifically those who have not completed an internship or wanted to hear about different industries that they do not have experience in. Students had an opportunity to ask questions to current students in the SRU Safety Program. 119 Students Attended.

September 19, 2024 – Present, Mentor Mentee Program: The intern mentorship program is designed to assist less experienced students with transitioning to their role as a safety intern. Some of the specific targets of the program are, finding a place to stay, what to expect, how to prepare, and how to make the best impression. Future interns are paired with students who have already completed their internship and can speak from experience. The hope is that these students may share some highlights from their experience, while also giving students some examples of what they wish they could have done better while working at the company.

September 23, 2025, Professional Headshots: SRU ASSP offered professional headshots for LinkedIn and other professional uses. 30 students took advantage of this opportunity.

October 21, 2025, PCL Construction Mock Interviews were conducted to help students prepare for the career fairs coming up. 10 students completed mock interviews.

October 22-23, 2025, Dr. Cali Scholarship Fundraiser. Buckets were passed around classes and at the Safety Management Career Fair and Meet and Greet, donations were made by students, staff, faculty, and alumni. Total money raised for the scholarship fund was \$1,300.

3.3 Section participation in community activities:

July 22-24, 2025, Safety 2025 in Orlando, Florida. Students engaged with professionals from the USA and nation-wide to learn safety related topics and network across several industries; students

met with Alumni to network and take a group photo. 2 Undergraduate students and 3 faculty.

September 12, 2025, Butler Elementary School Carnival – ASSP officers volunteered to help run games and set-up and tear-down from 3pm to 8pm at the local elementary school to help facilitate a safe event.

March 5, 2026, Special Olympics Polar Plunge. 3 ASSP officers raised \$279 for the Polar Plunge that goes to Special Olympic Fund. The officers then had to plunge into ice-cold water.

WELCOME NEW FACULTY- DR. MOORE (Q & A)

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO BECOME A PROFESSOR?

WHAT INSPIRED ME TO BECOME A PROFESSOR WAS MY DESIRE TO SHARE MY STORY AND HOPE THAT I COULD INSPIRE OTHERS, SHOWING THEM THAT THEY CAN TOO. BEFORE COMING TO COLLEGE (THE ROCK), I WENT TO SCHOOL FOR HVAC. I HAD NO INTENTION OF PURSUING COLLEGE, NOR DID I BELIEVE I WAS SMART ENOUGH FOR COLLEGE. HOWEVER, I HAD A FEW MENTORS IN MY LIFE WHO BELIEVED IN ME, WHICH ENCOURAGED ME TO TAKE A LEAP OF FAITH, STEP OUTSIDE MY COMFORT ZONE, AND TRY SOMETHING NEW. COLLEGE OPENED UP MANY GREAT LIFE-CHANGING EXPERIENCES, WHICH, FOLLOWING COLLEGE, ALLOWED ME TO TRAVEL ACROSS THE WORLD AND PURSUE SIGNIFICANT CAREER OPPORTUNITIES, ENABLING ME TO HAVE A DIVERSE RESUME/BACKGROUND. NOW, I WANT TO SHARE THOSE EXPERIENCES WITH OTHER STUDENTS, IN THE HOPE THAT THEY CAN BENEFIT FROM MY TESTIMONY AND EXPLORE THE MANY OPPORTUNITIES THE WORLD HAS FOR US.



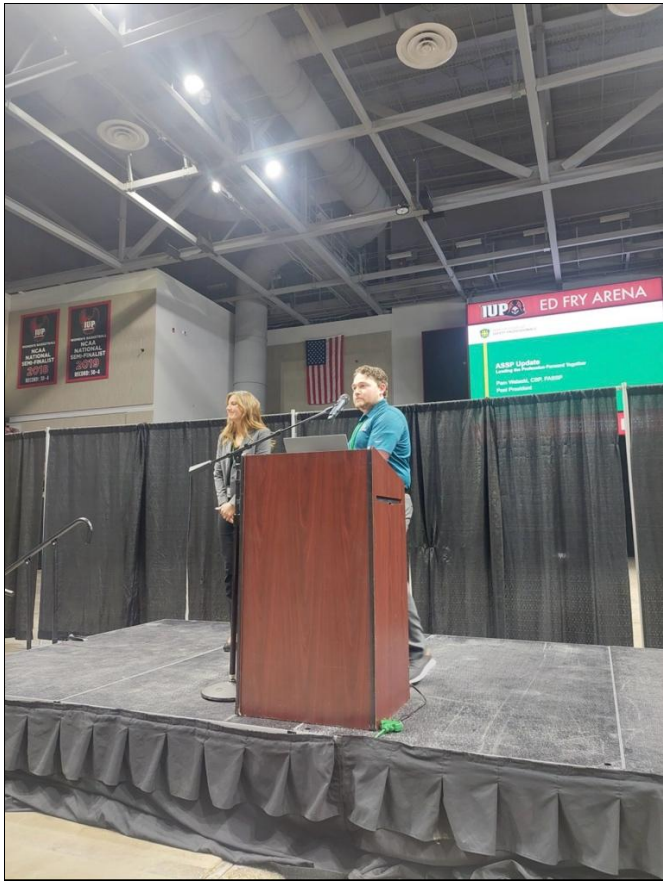

As faculty advisor for the Slippery Rock University student section of the American Society of Safety Professionals, it is my distinct pleasure to offer my strongest possible endorsement of this team's application for Outstanding Student Section of the Year.

Having worked with many student leaders over the years, I can say without hesitation that this is the most collaborative, engaged, and forward-thinking group of student leaders I have had the privilege to advise. Their work this year reflects not only a high level of activity, but a level of intentionality, professionalism, and impact that sets them apart.

The breadth and depth of their programming is exceptional. Over the past academic year, the section hosted a wide range of technical meetings featuring industry professionals across construction, mining, insurance, and energy sectors, with attendance regularly exceeding 40 to 50 students. These meetings were not passive presentations. They were interactive, hands-on, and directly connected to professional practice, including fall protection calculations, angle grinding safety training, and site tours such as the Eos Energy facility.

Equally impressive is their ability to engage students at scale. Their fall welcome-back event drew approximately 147 students, and their internship panel and career-focused programming consistently attracted strong attendance. This level of engagement demonstrates not only strong leadership, but a clear understanding of how to build a professional community that students want to be part of.

What truly distinguishes this group, however, is their commitment to developing others. Their mentor/mentee program continues to evolve as a meaningful pipeline for student success, pairing experienced interns with underclassmen to guide them through career preparation, housing decisions, and professional expectations. This initiative reflects a mature understanding of leadership and prioritizes sustainability and peer development.

Their community impact is equally noteworthy. From highway cleanups and coat drives to high school outreach and participation in events like the Special Olympics Polar Plunge, these students consistently extend their efforts beyond campus. They are not only preparing to enter the safety profession, they are actively living its values.

The section's commitment to professional involvement is also outstanding. Students attended and contributed to local and national ASSP events, including two undergraduate officers attending Safety 2025 in Orlando, Florida, and many more participating in the Western

Pennsylvania Chapter Professional Development Conference and other chapter activities. Their involvement in planning the Western PA PDC alongside professionals is particularly impressive and demonstrates their ability to operate as emerging leaders within the profession.

The section has also demonstrated strong engagement in student-led research. During this OSSA cycle, students presented the scope, design, and early progress of a research project examining rotational shiftwork and its impact on stress and sleep. This work was developed independently, approved through the IRB process, and shared at a professional conference, with data collection and analysis continuing beyond the OSSA submission period. In addition, the group has initiated a new research project focused on perceptions of the usefulness of exoskeletons for lifting tasks, further reinforcing their commitment to advancing knowledge in the field.

Finally, the level of recognition earned by these students is extraordinary. The section produced an extensive list of scholarship recipients across ASSP Foundation, industry, and regional awards, including multiple high-value scholarships. This is not incidental, it is the direct result of a culture that encourages students to pursue excellence and supports them in achieving it.

While the accomplishments listed in the OSSA packet are impressive on their own, what cannot be fully captured in a document is the way this group works together. Their collaboration is genuine, their leadership is shared, and their commitment to each other's success is evident in everything they do. They have created a student section that is not only highly active, but deeply impactful.

This is particularly evident in their approach to leadership transition. This year's graduating seniors made the intentional decision to hold elections early so incoming officers could attend the Professional Development Conference and learn alongside them and give them as much onboarding advice and transition as possible as they finish the academic year. This level of foresight and commitment to continuity speaks to the strength of their leadership and the culture they have built.

I am incredibly proud of this group and wholeheartedly support their application for Outstanding Student Section of the Year. They exemplify the mission, values, and future of the safety profession.
