Attendees will learn practical strategies to recognize warning signs, reduce lingering stigma and integrate suicide prevention and mental well-being into safety programs.
- The Closing General Session from 2:30-3:30 p.m. ET on July 24 features Liz Bohannon, a leading workplace connection expert and best-selling author. Drawing from her experience as an entrepreneur, she equips teams to design work environments that prioritize human connection and empower people to go faster and further together. Bohannon has a refreshing perspective that disrupts conventional organizational thinking, inspiring teams to unleash their full potential. She offers actionable strategies to create authentic, relationship-driven organizations where every person feels valued and supported.
